






























NP Harriers Work Hard



A Year Of Growth And Experience





Outstanding Experience






Led by Head Coach Jim Roman, The '76 Quakers closed with an unusual 5-3-2 record. The traditional Dover game brought one of the C.C. ties. Sr. Larry Trunk was named MVP of the game for the Quakers. With a 3-2-1 mark, Philly was third in the C.C. line. The Quakers were hampered by mid-season injuries. At one time, as many as 9 starters were out. Statistic-wise in the Cardinal Conference, Quaker's offense was #1 in rushing with 1692 yards. Sr. Tim Streb was the top C.C. rusher with 661 yards. Streb was also named Outstanding Offensive Back. Outstanding Offensive Lineman went to Sr. Tim Hostetler. Sr. Quarterback Ken Stiffler was named Offensive MVP. Defensively in the C.C., the Quakers were Number ONE overall! Sr. Gene (Bear) Schwartz earned C.C. Defensive Player of the Year. Schwartz was also named Defensive MVP. Seniors Mike Dummermuth and Glenn Kerns received Outstanding Defensive Lineman and Back. Most Improved players were Herb Rippley and Bob Daley. Quakers earn high ranks. Four players were picked for the First C.C. Team. Two earned the First Associated Press "AAA" Eastern District Team. when they played for the Second Time later in the Season.



Some fine individual efforts were given during the season, Rich Huston earned Best Batting Average with a .455 average.






Track Gals Show Great Improvement

The NPHS Girls Track Squad Earned its Best Record Ever with a Four Win, Three Loss Mark. This is the First Winning Record in the History of New Philadelphia Girls Track. This was achieved under second year Head Coach Patty Beaber. Not only did the Girls have a Fine turnaround from a 1-6 Record in Duel Meets the previous season, they also did quite well in large Meets. This Year the squad finished fifth of twelve at the Tornado Relays, fourth of ten at the Marietta Invitational, and third of seven at the Sectional. Success was the Result of Great individual efforts and the Combination of these in Relay Events. Andrea Marsh was awarded with Trophies for scoring the Most Points in Running Events, Field Events, and Track and Field Events combined. She and Julie Crites, both Seniors, shared Most Valuable Honors. The '77 Girls Team broke most of the existing Records for their Sport. These School Marks went to Marsh in the Long Jump and 100 Yard Dash, Senior Kathy Dague in the Mile Run, Crites in the 220 Yard Dash, Junior Margie Litts in the Hurdles and the 440, and Sophomore Suzanne Shade in the Shot, Discus, and 880 Yard Run.
