Spirit dominated Phila-Dover Week this year which began on Sunday, October 26 with the Berentz-Espenschied Telethon that raised over \$70,000 for the two fallen heroes. The coveted week built momemtum as NPHS observed "Hats off to Phila" on Monday, "Quaker supporter day" on Tuesday, "Spook 'em" on Wednesday, "We've got "44" spirit" on Thursday, and our traditional "Red and Black day" on Friday. Activities, spirit, and pride increased as the week progressed. After Thursday's spaghetti dinner and parade, we attended the most touching community pep rally ever held. The highlight of the pep rally was when Quaker Club President Dick Wood and Coach Jim Roman read a telegram from Steve Berentz announcing that he would attend the Phila-Dover game. NPHS won the spirit ribbon contest by purchasing 33,680 inches of spirit ribbon to Dover's 11,247 inches. Emotions were high as Steve entered Quaker Stadium at kick-off time. 
FURIOUS FINISH





DISTRICT RUNNER-UP






FOOTBALL










SHADE BREAKS RECORDS




SECOND IN C.C.








MATMEN TAKE THREE TO STATE









SECOND IN CC




DELPHIAN STAFF
