




Another Memorable Week















County as well a Carroll County and Hiland High School were present.


55 colleges and technical schools sent

CO-OP Programs

M.E., O.W.E., and O.W.A. give NPHS students an option in their education. These progrmas are designed to give work experience to students who do not plan on obtaining further education after high school.

Haney and Sam Mallernee qualified for state competition.


Mr. Chaney teaches the O.W.E program. This program includes sophomores, juniors, and seniors. His students also spend half of their day in school and the rest on the job.


Football

The 1986 football season marked the beginning of a new era in Quaker football history. The Quakers, under first year head coach, Dan Evans, opened the season with a convincing win over Cleveland South before embarking on a disasterous three game road trip. Upon their return to Quaker Stadium, the Red and Black matured into one of the most explosive teams fielded by New Philadelphia in many years.

The Quaker offense led, by recordsetting quarterback John Dummermuth's passing, the running of tailback Ed Veley and pass-catching of receivers Scott Yurich and Shane Sexton became virtually unstoppable in the second half of the season. 





Each person, whether a Freshman or a Senior, has made lasting friendships that are the most important part of high school.


